PASTOR JOE'S UPDATE

Update from Lead Pastor Joe Skogmo



As summer comes to a close, bring on the programmatic year! Rally Sunday (September 11th) and Rally Wednesday (September 14th) are around the corner, and I am hopeful for what is to come.

In many ways this programmatic year will be similar to last year's and I am so looking forward to that sense of routine. I am also grateful that Covid's more robust disruptions to our ways of being are behind us. I don't want to take that for granted, and I give God thanks for another year with all of you.

And...I think this programmatic year to come is a pivotal one. Last year we designed, excavated, poured foundations, set up scaffolding, and built. This year, we disassemble the scaffolding, and live into more long-lasting structures of ministry atop those foundations. For instance, to name a few things, we are officially into the second year of our redesign of children's ministry and Confirmation, we will lean into more defined ambitions regarding High School Youth Ministry, our Wednesday night weekly worship and faith formation is ready for another round, our music ministries will continue to find their way back into the rhythms of worship, our Adult Faith Formation continues to reawaken and create opportunities for fellowship and learning, Parish Health ministries will continue to reemerge and reactivate, our strategic planning continues in the next stages of development, and our Buildings & Grounds and Stewardship ministries continue with better vision after a year of reassembly and redefinition. After a lot of "waking up" and a lot of imagining, brainstorming, and implementing, this year is an important one.

I am deeply excited with what this coming programmatic year can be as we continue to form into who God is calling us, and as we continue to experience resurrection after the turmoil and dormancy that Covid brought us.

God is calling each of us to this moment and to this place and I encourage you to ask God where you can join into the Body of First Lutheran as we live into the year, whether that is helping with worship to read, greet, assist with communion, or usher, or whether that is to try out a Bible study or adult faith formation opportunity, join a music ministry, join a leadership team, contribute to a service project or ministry, help out in a Sunday/Wednesday School classroom or youth event, attend more fellowship opportunities, come to a Creation Care event, join a women's group, or try out different worship services throughout the year.

In any case, I am so thankful you're here. I pray that this year bears the spiritual fruits of more authentic relationships, greater presence in worship, and deeper learning of the faith for our whole community. I pray that during this programmatic year First Lutheran Church becomes less a factory of producing and consuming religious goods, and more of a profound community of God's people where we live into the promise and responsibility that we belong to one another.

Update from Pastor Lauryl Ivers, Associate Pastor

Saturday mornings are one of my Sabbath times – time I can just sit with a Bible in my lap and read and think and pray. I'm nearing the end of my "reading through the whole Bible" again, and this Summer I've been in the New Testament. For the past few weeks I've been reading the Epistles – the Apostle Paul's letters to the church where he had been, or hoped to be, doing missionary work while the first Christian churches were just getting started.



I'm relating more this time around – maybe because of where I'm at in my personal and professional life, and where the world seems to be - to what I'm reading in Paul's letters – as if Paul has written them personally, to me. I've savored and re-read some of the verses. They restore my heart and spirit when I suddenly realize I need that particular, healing Word. I put my name in places where a referent was intended, for example:

Ephesians 3:16-19: "(I suggest you put your name here) I pray that, according to the riches of his glory, he may grant that you will be strengthened in your inner being with power through his Spirit and that Christ may dwell in your heart through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love. I pray that you may have the power to comprehend, with all the saints, what is the breadth and length and height and depth and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God."


Or Philippians 1:3-6: I thank my God every time I remember you, (put your name here), constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. Remember that we held these meetings so the Vision Council could utilize your input for strategic planning efforts. Ultimately, we wanted to hear from as many of you as possible in the congregation about things such as what you think the church is doing well, what the church could do better, and what your greatest hope is for our church. This first meeting had the goal of going through all the comments received and attempt to identify common themes or patterns. Future meetings will then review these common themes and see what the Vision Council would like to work on by establishing goals, objectives, and strategies. This work will take some time, but we do not plan to wait until it is complete to share what we heard with the congregation. Pastor Joe will be looking for an opportunity in the coming weeks to discuss the comments received.

Besides strategic planning efforts, church leadership continues to finalize the details for HVAC and brick work repairs. Some good news was received regarding the HVAC repair this past month and it looks like we will not need to spend as much money as originally thought. This has led the Buildings and Grounds Committee to evaluate other building maintenance projects that need to be addressed, such as the parking lot. I know there is much interest in remodeling the kitchen and I want to reassure everyone that it is on the radar of church leadership. Unfortunately, I cannot provide a timeline on when these projects will be undertaken.

I wish everyone a great close to the summer season and I pray for a great start to our church programming year!



Grace and Peace from Norma Smith



"Make me know your ways, O Lord; Teach me Your paths. Lead me in Your truth & teach me, For You are the God of my salvation; For You I wait all the day." Psalm 25:4-5

During certain Vacation Bible Study activities, a casual onlooker might have thought they were a wild bunch. They also might have yearned for that level of energy & given thanks to the wonderful counselors who channeled that energy

so well. I was lucky enough to be the "Snack Lady" & witnessed the wonderful fellowship & learning fostered as the Luther Crest staff led by example.

The morning & afternoon snacks varied each day, with bananas one of the last afternoon snacks. I scanned each banana as I washed it, checking for any blemishes that would make it unenticing for the kids (we know those bananas would end up in the trash). It may have been a dried split in the skin, a spot of fungus, a soft spot, an obvious bruise, & sometimes a barely visible sign of bruising underneath the skin. When I thought about the journey that carried these bananas to First Lutheran's kitchen, it was not surprising that most displayed damage.

Most of our bananas are imported from Central America – Guatemala, Ecuador, Costa Rica, Colombia, Honduras. Workers with deft hands cut the bunches, loading them into boxes, baskets, sacks, crates, or other type of container. Repackaging, inspection, & other handling must be done carefully so the fruit isn't spoiled. Transport may include pack animals, small, motorized vehicles, & eventually they make it to the temperature-controlled semi-trailers, planes, or railcars that carry them northward. The boxes of tender fruit may be transferred multiple times between distribution points before they finally get to the stores from where we bring them into our homes. Bananas need good, strong, protective packaging to make it through the journey. My produce manager Dad once found a stowaway in a box of bananas. He called NDSU & they were more than happy to retrieve the tarantula secured in the box.

Each of our banana-eating kids has a journey to travel in life as well. As parents, we do our best to guide & protect our kids & prepare them for any tough spots they may face in life. No one gets through life unscathed. We do not know what difficulties they will contend with in life, but we want to wrap them in secure packaging that will strengthen them for the journey. What better way to do that than to teach them about the one Who loves beyond all imagining & Who is faithful in every moment of their lives. The one Who hears them & gives them hope to endure no matter what.

Watching kids experience this during VBS was wonderful to behold, & I'm so excited to see the kids & teachers begin another wonderful year of Sunday School to continue that path of discovery.
